

AN ORDINANCE RESTRICTING THE INSTALLATION, ERECTION OR MAINTENANCE OF OBSTRUCTIONS, WHICH WOULD DELAY OR IMPEDE EMERGENCY VEHICULAR TRAFFIC WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE NORMANDY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND REPLACING ORDINANCE NO: 73.

WHEREAS, Normandy Fire Protection District of St. Louis County was regularly incorporated by a Decree of the Circuit Court of St. Louis County, pursuant to the applicable provisions of Chapter 321 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Section 321,010, Paragraph 1 thereof, defines a "Fire Protection District" as a political subdivision, which is authorized and empowered to supply protection to persons and property against injuries and damages from fire, and which is also empowered to render first-aid for the purpose of saving lives and in giving assistance in the event of an emergency of any kind; and

WHEREAS, Normandy Fire Protection District of St. Louis County operates a modern Fire Department with several pieces of emergency equipment for the purpose of controlling and extinguishing fires within its boundaries and which also provides ambulance service for the benefit of the people whom it serves; and

WHEREAS, Such fire, ambulance service requires that the equipment used therefore be dispatched to the scene of the emergency at the earliest possible moment; and

WHEREAS, Such obstructions would also constitute a definite hazard to the safety and well-being of the personnel of the District and to the equipment used for emergency purpose,

WHEREAS, It is the considered judgement of the Board of Directors of Normandy Fire Protection District that the installation, erection or maintenance of artificial barrier on public or private streets or roadways within the boundaries of the District constitutes a definite hazard to the safety and welfare of the property and the inhabitants of the District; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF NORMANDY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT OF ST. LOUIS COUNTY, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following definitions shall apply:

- a. "Street or roadway" shall mean any roadway, public or private, within the boundaries of the Normandy Fire Protection District, which is used by the public for vehicular traffic,
- b. "Person or persons" shall mean all individuals, firms, partnerships, corporations, Board or Board of Trustees, cities, towns and villages operating and functioning within the boundaries of the Normandy Fire Protection District.
- c. "Obstructions or barriers" shall include, but shall not be limited to the following: any fence or gate with the following exceptions.
 - a. If manned full time by a person whenever gate is closed.
 - b. If equipped with a automatic opening device with manual release system.

Saw horse barricade, pipe, chain, stone, ditch, mound or bump erected or maintained for the purpose of delaying or impeding vehicular traffic, except as defined in Section 1, Paragraph D.

- d. "Speed bumps" shall meet the following specifications:
base of "speed bumps" to be not less than thirty six (36) inches in width and with a maximum height of two (2) inches, at the apex or center of the base width, tapering from a maximum height of 2 inches to a smooth joint with the base pavement. All "speed bumps" will have a minimum separation of two hundred (200) feet, all "speed bumps" will be painted and maintained with a reflective yellow paint, appropriate signs will be installed to indicate "speed bumps", fire district must receive a letter of intent to install "speed bumps" with ten (10) working days prior to their installation and the location where "speed bumps" are to be installed.

SECTION 2: Whenever the Fire Chief of the Normandy Fire Protection District, or his duly authorized deputy or assistant, shall find such an obstruction in a public or private street or roadway, he shall notify the person or persons responsible for the installation, erection or maintenance of such obstruction to remove same within twenty-four (24) hours. If the identity of the person or persons responsible for the installation, erection or maintenance of such obstruction CANNOT be readily ascertained, then the Fire Chief, or his duly authorized deputy or assistant, is empowered and authorized to remove such obstruction from such street or roadway.


SECTION 3: Within the boundaries of the Normandy Fire Protection District, any person or persons installing, erecting or maintaining any obstruction in, on or to any public or private street or roadway shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished according to law.

SECTION 4: This ordinance being deemed of any emergency nature, it shall be in full force from and after its passage.



Board of Directors


